### Eligibility

<b>Eligible Institutions</b>	SRC approved administrating organisations (i.e. Swedish non-profit research performing organisations, e.g. universities, university hospitals, county councils)
<b>Additional requirements</b>	Swedish Applicants must: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) have a PhD.</li><li>2) be affiliated with an SRC approved administrating organisation. Please refer to general applicant eligibility requirements found <a href="#">here</a>.</li><li>3) communicate with the JPND national contact person regarding their intention to participate in the call, before submission of the consortium application.</li><li>4) submit a parallel application using SRC's application system Prisma (this applies to all Swedish project leaders participating in the call). The application form in Prisma can be reached from the call text at <a href="#">SRC's website</a>. Parallel application is a mandatory eligibility criterion. Failure to submit the parallel application to the Swedish Research Council before the deadline of the Prisma call will result in the Swedish partner being declared ineligible.</li></ol> Swedish applicants may not: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) have an ongoing JPND grant, or any other project grant concerning the same project concept,</li></ol>

## Budget

<b>Total earmarked national budget</b>	15M SEK
<b>Anticipated no. of funded groups</b>	5
<b>Budget restrictions</b>	<p>All sums are total for 3 years. Minimum sum: 1,2 MSEK (approx 105 000 EUR). Maximum sum: 2,5 MSEK (approx 220 000 EUR) per project with 1 Swedish partner. Maximum sum: 3,5 MSEK (approx 305 000 EUR) per project with 2 Swedish partners.</p> <p>If one of the Swedish participants coordinates the consortium, then this applicant may apply for an extra 500 000 SEK (approx. 45 000 EUR) in addition to the maximum sum for partner(s).</p> <p>Use the exchange rate of 1 EURO=11,55 SEK to calculate actual grant amounts for the application.</p>
<b>Eligible costs</b>	<p>The project grant may be used to fund all types of project-related costs, such as salaries (including your own salary, however no more than corresponding to the person's activity level in the project), running costs (such as consumables, travel including stays at research facilities, publication costs and minor equipment), premises and depreciation costs.</p> <p>Grants may not be used for scholarships. If a doctoral student participates, project funds may not be paid out as salary during teaching or other departmental duties.</p>
