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### Eligibility

<b>Eligible Institutions</b>	In order to be eligible to apply for funding, an Institution must be an <a href="#">approved HRB Host Institution</a> no later than two calendar months before the closing date of a call. See also the <a href="#">Policy on Approval of HRB Host Institutions</a>
<b>Additional requirements</b>	Applicants seeking HRB funding must consult the HRB Guidance and FAQs for this call for important eligibility information: <a href="#">HRB Funding Schemes</a> .  The below documentation is required on submission: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• New applicants to HRB for Joint Transnational Calls must submit a short form at submission to provide details on PI's track record for eligibility checks.</li><li>• A letter of support will be required at submission stage for any Lead Applicants who do not have a permanent post at a HRB Host Institution. Please refer to the guidance on the HRB scheme page for further information.</li><li>• At full proposal stage, applicants must complete HRB's Budget and Deliverables templates. 	<p><b>Coordinators:</b>  €405,000 direct costs (with the additional €75,000 for coordination-specific activities);  €530,000 including overheads.</p> <p>HRB will not provide funding for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Proposals involving basic biomedical research</li> <li>• Research intended to create human embryos solely for the purposes of research or for the purposes of stem cell procurement, including by means of somatic cell nuclear transfer.</li> <li>• Applications from individuals applying for, holding, or employed under funding received from the tobacco industry;</li> <li>• Applications from individuals applying for, holding, or employed under funding received from the alcohol industry and related actors.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Eligible costs</b></p>	<p>Funding available is inclusive of overheads and pension contributions and will cover research-related costs including: salary for research staff, postgraduate stipends and fees for Master’s students only, direct running costs, equipment (up to €10,000), travel, data management, Public and Patient Involvement, dissemination, and overheads contributions. Sub-contracting for the provision of a service can be covered up to a maximum of 20% of direct costs. This would need to conform with the Host Institution, National and EU procurement rules.</p> <p>Overheads are applied in accordance with the <a href="#">HRB Policy on Usage of Overheads</a>. The HRB will contribute to the indirect costs of the research through an overhead payment of 30% of Total Direct Modified Costs (TDMC, excludes student fees, equipment and capital building costs) for laboratory or clinical-based research and 25% TDMC of desk-based research. For the caps on overheads see above section on “Maximum funder per grant awarded to a partner”.</p>
