Eligibility

Eligible Institutions	Proposals may be submitted by the entities specified in Article 27 (1) of <u>the Act on the National Science Centre</u> (NCN Act). For further details on eligibility of applicants, as well as terms of entry, please check <u>the Annex to the NCN Council</u> <u>Resolution on funding granted within calls for proposals for</u> <u>international research projects (UNISONO)</u>
Additional requirements	 Up to 7 days of the end of full proposals' submission, Polish applicants are obliged to prepare a national proposal and submit it to the NCN electronically via the OSF submission system available at: <u>http://www.osf.opi.org.pl</u> Polish partners may apply for NCN funding of their basic research projects, as laid down in Article 2(1) of the NCN Act. Other applicable documents: Open Access Policy at the NCN; Data Management Plan requirements; Personal Data Processing at the NCN.

Budget restrictions	The project budget must be justified as regards the subject and scope of research and based on realistic calculations. The budget must include expenditures eligible for funding from NCN resources (the so-called eligible costs). Where

	unjustified costs are planned, the proposal may be rejected. The costs of open access to publications may only be incurred as indirect costs. The cost of open access planned as direct costs will be regarded as a formal error. Remuneration of administrative staff and costs of conference organisation (rental of rooms, catering) may be financed solely as indirect expenses. Eligible costs	Applicants may apply for funding of costs relevant, necessary, and directly connected to the proposed research project, including:
	• Salaries and scholarships (including post-doc positions and scholarships/salaries for students and PhD students). Please note: if the principal investigator is also the coordinator of an international consortium submitting a joint proposal the budget of salaries and scholarships may be increased.
	• Research equipment, devices and software: applicants may seek funding for research equipment up to PLN 500 000 per unit.
	• Other direct costs: materials and consumables, outsourcing and subcontracting, business trips, visits and consultations, collective investigators, other costs;
	• Overheads: indirect costs of open access of up to 2% of direct costs that may be spent on open access to publications and research data; other indirect costs of up to 20% of direct costs that may be spent on costs that are related indirectly to the research project, including the cost of open access to publications and research data.
